# Security takes off

– launching business security in a global perspective

How to do it is the focus of the whole conference. The different speakers will provide authentic advice and solutions on how to deal with security issues.

Remember the quote from the poem by Bill Hancock last year:

“Unfortunate it is that our corporate masters don’t understand,  
That security is something that is always, every-day not on-demand.

And yet decree that secure we must and always should be,  
Without providing management wisdom, guidance or money.”

Today every company lives in a global world. Therefore it is interesting to see how the global organizations can contribute to a higher security level.



*Bruce Schneier* is an internationally renowned security expert. He is the author of eight books -- including the best sellers “Beyond Fear: Thinking Sensibly about Security in an UncertainWorld,” “Secrets and Lies,” and

“Applied Cryptography”. This latter volume, explained how the arcane science of secret codes actually works, and was described by *Wired* as “the book the National Security Agency wanted never to be published.” His book on computer and network security, “Secrets and Lies”, was called by *Fortune* “[a] jewel box of little surprises you can actually use.” Bruce Schneier is the founder and CTO of Counterpane Internet Security Inc, that monitors more than 450 networks in 35 countries, in every time zone.

*Nicklas Dahlström* is a teacher and researcher at Lund University School of Aviation (L.U.S.A.), one of the few universities with higher education in aviation emphasizing the area of Human Factors, a subject that includes how people act in different socio-technical systems. The areas where this knowledge has been applied are mostly security and safety issues within aviation and other transports, chemicals and the nuclear-power industry. Nicklas has held lectures for personnel within the aviation, marine, pharmaceutical and medical sectors.

*Hans Dahlquist* is Vice President and CSO of Security and Risk Management at the Ericsson Group in Stockholm. In this role he has direct responsibility for Information Security, Physical Security, Personal Security, Crisis Management and Risk Management and Insurances. He previously held a position in the Swedish Armed Forces HQ with rank of Colonel at Military Intelligence and Security Directorate as Head of Information and Communication Security Department.

*Robert Malmgren* has been working as an Information Security Consultant for more than 10 years. His focus is the practical aspects of IT and information security, with special interest in computer networks and industrial applications. In his work, Robert Malmgren has participated in implementing a system to continuously follow up and supervise the security in a large cooperation.

*Agneta Syrén* has a Master of Law degree from the University of Stockholm and a Bachelor of Science degree in Criminology from the University of Uppsala. She is presently Security Director of Länsförsäkringar AB, an Insurance Company and Bank. Agneta is also the well-known author of security handbooks. “Creeping Threats” addresses stalking. “Black Money” is about money laundering, and “At Your Own Risk”, deals with Information Security.
